President's Message

I Want A Sunday Kind of Love

"...when we opened ourselves and made paying attention to newcomers a spiritual practice, we transformed ourselves. The very practice of reaching out made us more open, more sensitive. Spiritual practices, do that. They change us".

This was a message from Peter Morales, UUA President in his letter in this Spring's UU World. His article was addressing the hospitality, or rather lack of hospitality, that many visitors experience when visiting our UU congregations. He shared stories he had heard from others as well as his personal experiences. When serving as a parish minister, his membership committee decided to observe what visitors experienced. He said often their guests were not warmly greeted and often stood awkwardly alone at coffee hour. His committee was appalled and embarrassed at what they observed.

I smugly thought, well he hasn't visited SUUF! I visualized the visitors to our fellowship. I could not picture anyone coming to our service on a Sunday and not having someone engage them after the service. More likely there are several people making their way to the newcomer to welcome them. But the more I thought about it, I realized that some of the same people are often the ones that reach out and make sure our guests feel accepted and welcome. Perhaps hospitality is a practice we should all try to embrace. Many people are seeking religious homes and we at SUUF have been blessed to have "spiritual seekers" give us a try each week. We want them to return. As Morales states, "They want to be accepted, to be engaged, to be loved". We can each do this with a smile and a simple hello.

And let's not forget that it isn't just the newcomer that needs this friendly greeting and someone to reach out to them. Maybe we take it for granted that other members of our fellowship are feeling comfortable and accepted. I had to stop and ask myself, do I initiate conversations with someone new at coffee hour or just seek out those I feel most comfortable with? Do I look around for those that might be standing alone or may be looking a bit awkward? Do I try to get to know new people? Do I let people get to know me? Does my fellowship "buddy" need a call from me?

Get transformed! Get to know someone new at your next coffee hour and let them get to know you.


